A Message from Pastor Laura

Lent is here, and thus we come full circle.

If you will remember, the pandemic began in Pittsburgh on Friday, March 13, 2020. The church had just celebrated a meal on the Wednesday prior and listened to the Rev. Dr. Dan Merry speak on God's work in Malawi. We knew the pandemic was near but were unsure of what changes it would bring. The

session voted to move worship online for March 15. They then voted to stay online until the end of March. And then they voted to stay online through the end of May. We formed a Re-Entry Team in the belief that we would return to the sanctuary in mid-June. None of this came to pass.

Instead, the session, the congregation, and I adapted. We learned to worship from our cars. We grew exponentially in our technological capabilities. Zoom became a household word, and our main form of gathering. YouTube became a main conduit for worship when the parking lot was closed. By the power of the Holy Spirit, we showed what a resilient, capable, and loving church we are - inside the building or not!

As we approach Lent once again, now is the perfect time to reflect over the past year. Reflect over the person you have become. Reflect on what it is that you have missed. (My guess is that you've missed people far more than you've missed material things!) Reflect on what God has been up to in your life since Lent 2020 - have any of your beliefs about God and Jesus changed? What has been strengthened in your faith? What has been challenged? When has God been palpably with you, and how did you see it?

For those of you journeying through The Year of the Bible, my hope is that our daily readings will help you in your reflection on the work of God through this pandemic season. Please know that I am praying for you as we continue this Scriptural adventure together.

May the Lord be with you this Lent, beloved in Christ, and in the Eastertide that is to come!

Music Notes By Shelby Gracey

For those who know me, you will remember that our summer family vacations always consisted of going to our friend's cabin in the mountains of Western North Carolina. One of our favorite activities was to make the 35-mile drive over to Asheville on Saturday nights for "Shindig on the Green." We would spend the evening listening to local musicians playing their beloved mountain music and watching talented clogging groups. In addition to the high-energy bluegrass instrumentals, we also enjoyed the beautiful folk tunes that down from had been passed generation to generation.

As we reflect on the upcoming season of Lent, one of the hymns that is sung and played during this time is *What Wondrous Love is This*. "This hymn, with its plaintive sound, is one of the best known of our authentic American folk hymns. Like all true folk music, the origins of this text and music remain unknown. It is simply the product of devout people who, when reflecting seriously on the sacrificial gift of God's Son, respond spontaneously with amazed adoration for this 'wondrous love'."

"One typical folk hymn characteristic found in these words is the repetition of key phrases such as "O my soul" and *I'll sing on*." Since folk music is generally learned aurally without the assistance of the printed page or musical notation, such repetition is necessary. The melodic lines of this song also enhance the thought and personal application of the words.

"The hymn first appeared in 1835 in a collection titled *Southern Harmony* by William Walker. These simply stated words, with their appealing music, have since ministered to people everywhere, extolling the profound truth of Christ's love for each of us."
