A Message from Pastor Laura



What do Hugh Jackman, the Dalai Lama, and Dolly Parton have in common? All three have received their COVID-19 vaccine. As have many of the senior citizens, teachers, and other qualifying individuals from our congregation.

This good news of the vaccine has created much joy and hope. This is evidenced in the increasing attendance at our 10:15 Sunday morning worship service. Every week sees an increase, peaking at 67 in attendance on Easter! Hallelujah, praise be to God!

And, yet, we all know that the pandemic is not over yet. Children and teenagers aren't vaccinated, and new strains of the virus have caused new questions.

What does this mean for us as a church?

We need to continue to be patient. As we read in The Year of the Bible in March, Paul writes about the importance of patience to the church at Rome. Their affliction comes in the form of persecution. Emperor Nero, who welcomes the Jewish population back to Rome, turns out to be a pretty awful man - he's eventually going to inaccurately blame the Christians for a fire that burns much of Rome, and persecutes both Jewish and Gentile Christians. It's a torrent of violence that, frankly, puts this pandemic in perspective. In response to this violence and affliction, Paul calls the church to patience.

The only way patience is possible is with prayer. I know this from personal experience. When I struggle with patience, especially in 2020/21, I have been known to say aloud, "Give me patience, Lord Jesus." Why? Because this season is hard! We want Fellowship Hour! We want church dinners! We want to hug the huggers from our congregation! We want life to get back to our church normal! And, with the joy of the vaccinations, the pain of being apart is felt all the more. How do we find the patience to endure it? We find it in prayer.

The Wilson Hall Bible study will continue to meet in person in Wilson Hall. They will be discussing the book of Psalms.




